

Breaking the Curse of Poverty Part 1

Overview: When Adam sinned, God declared that there was a curse on the earth and Adam would eat of it in sorrow all the days of his life (Gen 3:17). But after the flood cleansed the earth, Noah offered to God burnt offerings of every clean beast and God said, "I will not again curse the ground any more for man's sake." (Gen 8:20-21). But the curse continues on earth to this day because of sin due to the fact that the defeated satan is still being accepted by many as the god of this earth (2 Cor 4:4).

A. Curses before the Law.

- 1. Pre-law was from Adam to Moses.
 - a) For until the law sin was in the world: but sin is not imputed when there is no law. Rom 5:13 Rom 5:14
 - b) Nevertheless death reigned from Adam to Moses.

2. The Curse.

- a) Cursed is the ground for thy sake; in sorrow shall you eat of it all the days of thy life. Gen 3:17
- b) Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, Wherein have we robbed Mal 3:8 thee? In tithes and offerings.
- c) Ye are cursed with a curse: for ye have robbed me, even this whole nation. Mal 3:9 d) God said that He would heal our land if we repented 2Chr 7:14
- e) All of creation is groaning, waiting for the manifestation of the sons of God. Ro 8:19-23

3. The Remedy.

- a) Cain brought of the fruit of the ground an offering unto the LORD. And Abel, he Ge 4:3-5 also brought of the firstlings of his flock and of the fat thereof. The LORD had respect unto Abel and to his offering: But unto Cain and to his offering he had not respect.
- b) Tithing breaks the curse on the earth. Mal 3:10 Mal 3:11
- c) Tithing makes God your partner.

4. The Benefits.

- a) Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and Mal 3:10 prove me now herewith, saith the LORD of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it.
- b) I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, and he shall not destroy the fruits of your Mal 3:11 ground; neither shall your vine cast her fruit before the time in the field, saith the LORD of hosts.

B. Curses under the Law.

- 1. The Law was from Moses to Jesus.
 - a) For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ. John 1:17

2. The Curse.

- a) But it shall come to pass, if thou wilt not hearken unto the voice of the LORD Deu 28:15 thy God, to observe to do all his commandments and his statutes which I command thee this day; that all these curses shall come upon thee, and overtake thee:
- b) Cursed shalt thou be in the city, and cursed shalt thou be in the field. Deu 28:16
- c) Also every sickness, and every plague, which is not written in the book of this Deu 28:61 law, them will the LORD bring upon thee, until thou be destroyed.
